

## **ABOUT OSAC**

The Organization of Saskatchewan Arts Councils (OSAC) acts as an umbrella for community arts councils and schools across the province. Across Saskatchewan, we bring people and the arts together. In more than 80 towns and cities, local arts councils and schools are keeping the arts alive. Thanks to their efforts, those communities enjoy live musical and theatre performances, visual art exhibitions, workshops, and special events.

In the 2024/2025 season, OSAC presented 171 performances by 36 different artists in 37 communities. The School Touring Program offered in-person presentations involving the following disciplines: Haida & Squamish Storytelling, Issue Based Theatre, Hip Hop Dance & Theatre Residencies. The total audience numbers were approximately 16,927 students and teachers. There were four tours, involving 56 schools and travelling to 35 communities throughout the province. Lead teachers in each school contributed approximately 96 non-classroom hours to coordinate these presentations. 13 visual and media arts exhibitions toured 60 venues throughout the province and were viewed by over 33,000 people, including approximately 590 tours. Out of the total number of viewers, roughly 1400 people participated in exhibition programming, which included artist talks, hands-on or informational workshops, gallery receptions, and events. OSAC is a member based eligible provincial cultural organization, funded by Saskatchewan Lotteries. 

Artists featured in three of our upcoming touring exhibitions will deliver brief artist talks and workshop demonstrations, providing insight into how you can engage your community when scheduling these exhibitions.



**Dean Bauche** is a cultural consultant, professional artist, curator, educator and adjudicator. He has 40 years of cultural and gallery experience as a consultant, Director of Galleries for the City of North Battleford and the Director/ Curator of the Allen Sapp Gallery. Bauche works in traditional media, including acrylic, and copper, but is best known for his evocative portraits in oil, watercolor and encaustic. His art explores the many dimensions of the human

journey: spirit, body, mind, and place.

Dave Pelletier was born in Balcarres, raised in Lebret and later moved to Moose Jaw in 1968, which has been home ever since. His parents were William Pelletier of Lebret, and Corinne McArthur from the White Bear First Nation in Saskatchewan. Dave joined the military after high school, and returned back to Moose Jaw in 1977. In 1978, he trained at the Saskatchewan Technical Institute in Radio/TV Electronic Servicing and worked



in that field for a couple of years. It was during that time that Dave became involved in Friendship Centres to eventually become Executive Director of the Friendship Centre in Moose Jaw. It was this connection that inspired his interest in his own Indigenous background and led him to seek out the legends and stories of his culture.

After completing a Diploma in Business at SIAST, he took the initiative to start his own business in 2003 - Moosgaw Arts & Gifts in Moose Jaw and began to pursue his own ideas and interpretations of the Indigenous world in his paintings. In 2023, he retired from working as a federal government employee at 15 Wing. His work has been exhibited in Saskatchewan and is in numerous

private collections throughout Canada.

**Cristian Barreno** is an Indigenous Mayan visual artist from Guatemala, now living in Treaty 4 Territory. Working primarily in acrylics and oils, he creates vibrant semi-realistic landscapes, wildlife, and portraits that honor his Mayan heritage and the culture of Turtle Island.

His art has been inspired by both his roots and the land he now calls home. He continues to explore new forms of expression, including carving and sculpting, while engaging in community projects that connect him with other talented artists.

In more than a 25-year career in the performing arts, he has worked in theatres in 4 provinces, which include

the National Arts Centre, E. A. Rawlinson Centre for the Arts, and Keyano Theatre. Past related experience includes a member-at-large for the Arts Touring Alliance of Alberta (ATAA), co-leader of the Canadian working group for contemporary circus with MICC, Treasurer for CAPACOA, and founding member of the Camrose Arts Council. He is also a very active member of the Prairie Regional Presenters Coalition. Nicholas was the 2024 recipient of the Rhoda Taylor Award for significant contribution to the arts touring industry in Alberta from ATAA.

The Jeanne and Peter Lougheed Performing Arts Centre opened in 2014 and is located on the University of Alberta, Augustana Campus in Camrose, Alberta. The Lougheed Centre is home to a 584 seat fly house, a 96 seat cabaret venue, and a 199 seat outdoor plaza.

#### SHARAI MUSTATIA

#### **KEEP GOING**



sharai mustatia is a Métis/Romanian artist whose work is shaped by their journey of healing through intergenerational trauma. As a mother who was coerced into giving up two children for adoption, their art explores survival, loss, and a search for belonging. Through analogue photography and experimental techniques, sharai's images are emotional and spiritual reflections, layered with meaning, healing, and processes of reconciliation with past and present.

At the heart of sharai's work is a desire to connect—not only with themselves but with others who may share struggles through grief and loss. As sharai explores their ancestral roots, their understanding of where they come from informs how the past affects their own life. sharai's art of visual storytelling becomes a path of potent self-forgiveness and reclaiming pieces of themselves thought lost.

"KEEP GOING" is a space of healing, self-discovery, and a reminder that transformation, growth, and belonging are attainable.

#### **DAVE PELLETIER**

#### Wóknaga (He Tells His Own Story)



The exhibition, Wóknaga¹, Nakoda for "He Tells His Own Story"², features paintings by Métis/Nêhiyawak/Nakoda/Anishinaabe/ Scottish artist, Dave Pelletier, of môso-tâpiskan³, now known as Moose Jaw. Working within a Woodland School style, Pelletier honours Indigenous intergenerational transfer of knowledge through storytelling within these canvases, while offering his own imagined narratives that play out through the graphic and colourful compositions of animals and figures of Turtle Island. Inspired by the work of Norval Morriseau, Pelletier's compositions, of stylized, abstracted forms, bold colours and crisp, black outlines and energy lines, offer narratives that speak to the artist's own search for traditional knowledge and his journey to place himself and connect with his Indigenous cultures.

#### NISTO Curated by Melanie Monique Rose

Nisto is the Cree word for "three," which holds abundant cultural, religious, and spiritual significance throughout Treaty Territories 4 and 6, Abya Yala¹, and across the world. The braid, made of three strands, carries teachings of the unity of mind, body, and spirit, and connects us to our ancestors and heritage.

Artists Cristian Barreno (Maya K'iche'), Maria Rose Sikyea (Yellowknives Dene), and Emma Noyes (Sinixt) are three Indigenous artists rooted both in their homelands and in diaspora, with deep



connections to water, sky, and land. Their families lived here long before the names "Canada," the medicine line, borders, or walls existed. Indigenous peoples had lifeways, paths, and relationships sustained through trade, celebration, and war. For example, before Canada declared the Sinixt² "extinct" in 1956 and before the creation of the Canada–US border, they freely harvested and hunted on their ancestral homelands. In 2021, their territorial rights were restored, yet they still face obstacles crossing the border to return to their homelands.

Despite the enduring challenges of colonialism, these three artists affirm their presence and relationality through their work. They honor, celebrate, and assert that they are here, always have been, and always will be.




#### **MACLAYNE**

Inspired by historical events of the Métis people of Canada, this original play for young audiences explores the loves, the losses and the fight of Treaty 6's Métis people – and their love and kinship to the buffalo.

Success begins with believing you can! Amanda Panda gets students excited about trying new things, embracing who they are, and shining their unique light in the world. A solo performance to inspire passion, play and perseverance while showcasing a variety of creative athletic feats involving hula hoops, juggling, spinning plates and humor. Amanda playfully engages students and staff with her skills to demonstrate the importance of stepping out of your comfort zone, embracing your mistakes, and that practice makes progress. Chris McKhool is a Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal recipient for creating community through music. He has a Lebanese father and an Egyptian-born mother who happened to play piano, teach classical theory, and feed her young son as much Middle Eastern cuisine as she did music lessons. From there, the powerful violinist developed a taste for multi-genre string sounds and found a like-minded crew of all-world enthusiasts. When McKhool first heard founding guitarist Kevin's rumba rhythm, their musical synergy created Sultans of String's signature sound – the intimate and playful relationship between violin and guitar.

Kevin Laliberté has toured the world with guitarist and recording artist Jesse Cook. Highlights of his five-year tenure with Jesse include an appearance on the Tonight Show with Jay Leno, backing up Charlotte Church. Kevin has released five solo albums of his unique brand of original instrumental music, blending the sounds of flamenco, bossa-nova, pop and jazz with the romance of the Spanish guitar. His music has been used in film and TV. In addition to his role as co-founder and co-composer of Sultans of String, Kevin has also been the long-time guitarist and songwriting collaborator with Latin vocalist and recording artist Amanda Martinez, touring Canada, the USA, Mexico, and appearing at the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa.
