What does it mean to be part of the in crowd? In an imaginary letter to her absent older brother, Braidie struggles to understand news stories about the torture and murder of a local teenage girl and how the brutality she sees in the headlines is reflected in her own friend group. Revisiting memories, Braidie tracks her own complicity and participation in the bullying of one girl and considers what it means to go too far. **The Shape of a Girl** challenges audiences to interrogate their capacity to both help and harm others and to be brave when standing up for what is right. As relevant as ever, Green Thumb Theatre premiered The Shape of a Girl over 20 years ago, and the piece has since gone on to hundreds of productions worldwide. **The Shape of a Girl** goes far beyond a simple dramatization of the seemingly inexplicable code of silence and tacit complicity which surrounded the sensationalized Reena Virk murder in 1997 on which the play is based. It speaks clearly and compassionately about a world that's becoming more divided by hate and group conflicts and suggests that trust is the only way to break this cycle of violence. In 2023/24, the School Touring Program offered performances involving the following disciplines: Music with a Science Component, Cultural Diversity and Awareness, Hoop Dance and Storytelling. Total audience numbers were 25,568 students and teachers. There were four tours, involving 74 schools and travelling to 52 communities throughout the province. Lead teachers in each school contributed approximately 107 non-classroom hours to coordinate these presentations. Each year, Saskatchewan students, many of whom live in rural areas, enjoy music, dance, drumming, mime, theatre, magic, storytelling, and circus arts performances. Each fall and spring, professional performing artists from Saskatchewan, Canada and beyond, are selected by a jury of teachers, arts educators and youth for their artistic excellence and special ability to interact with and relate to student audiences. Study guides, with suggestions for pre- and post-concert discussion and activities, are sent to schools before each tour. Block booking helps to lower the fee/performance because travel expenses are amortized over two or three weeks. Beginning with the 2025-26 season, school centres pay a \$50 annual associate member fee when they book, and a \$10 booking fee is added to the price of each presentation. OSAC celebrated 50 years as an organization in 2018 and has nurtured the traditions of presenting excellence in the performing arts for adults, children and family audiences in various genres and disciplines. OSAC annually presents over 300 live community and school performances, attended by a total audience of approximately 75,000. This is possible because of a dedicated network of volunteers committed to making culture an integral part of Saskatchewan community life, and vital funding from Sask Lotteries, SaskCulture Inc. and Canadian Heritage. Sask Lotteries is celebrating 50 years as the main fundraiser for more than 12,000 sport, culture and recreation groups in communities across the province! Since 1974, through an agreement with the Government of Saskatchewan, lottery sales in Saskatchewan have been used to provide more than \$1.4 billion to support athletes from the grassroots level to the international stage, connect youth to artistic experiences, help residents experience the beauty of the parks that cover the province and so much more.
