About the Artist

Daniel Tamagi, *The FloWarrior* is a world-renowned award-winning instructor, multidisciplinary performance artist, and motivational speaker from Alberta. With a Master's degree in Medical Physics, and over a decade as a professional performance artist, he possesses a powerful blend of academic and artistic backgrounds which he draws upon to connect with, inspire, and empower audiences of all ages. Using his spectacular performance skills and shared love of popular culture (star wars, anime, videogames etc.); he has a unique ability to captivate young audiences' attention, gain their respect, and impact them with his story. He has pioneered his own unique brand of 'martial artistry' through years of training and dedication to his craft, by combining his passions for dance, martial arts and music, while exploring his cultural heritage as a Japanese Canadian. Having experienced firsthand the power that art has to transform lives for the better, he is on a mission to share the gift of inspiration with the next generation and empower them to find their own unique Path of Purpose in an ever-changing modern world.

About the Show

"How to Unlock Your Superpowers" has reached over 11,000 students and is designed to inspire and empower students to discover/develop their unique gifts. *Main themes:* skill development, intuition, creativity, growth mindset.

Key Points:

- Teaches students that they all have unique gifts, or "superpowers," that are waiting to be discovered
- Facilitates a deeper connection to their intuition and inspiration, helping them uncover their individual strengths
- Shares a transformative "secret recipe" for nurturing and developing these extraordinary gifts

Key show elements:

- *Captivating Performances:* A diverse range of thrilling performances captures students' attention and respect, ensuring they remain engaged throughout the show.
- *Meaningful Connections:* Each performance is linked to important lessons on creativity, skill development, critical thinking, and more, reinforcing the educational impact.
- *Cultural Relevance:* Elements of popular culture and cultural identity that resonate with students—such as lightsabers, martial arts, and anime/cosplay—enhance both the enjoyment and effectiveness of the lessons.
- *Interactive Participation:* Audience involvement, including both students and teachers, boosts interactivity and fosters a deeper connection to the material.

About OSAC

The **Organization of Saskatchewan Arts Councils (OSAC)** acts as an umbrella for community arts councils and schools across the province, bringing people and the arts together. In more than 80 communities, local arts councils and schools enrich community life by presenting live music, theatre, visual arts, workshops, and special events, ensuring that residents of all ages can experience the arts close to home.

Through the **Performing Arts in Schools touring program**, students from urban, rural, and reserve schools experience live music, theatre, dance, storytelling, and a variety of artistic performances and workshops. Professional performing artists from Saskatchewan, Canada, and beyond bring artistic excellence, study guides with curriculum connections, and a special ability to engage students.

In **2025/2026**, the Performing Arts in Schools program offered in-person performances in the following disciplines: Circus Arts, Issue-Based Theatre for Middle Years and High School audiences, Magic, Ventriloquism, and Theatre for Elementary audiences. There were **five tours** and **88 presentations**, involving over **70 schools** across **52 communities** throughout the province. These performances reached approximately **20,066 students and teachers**.

This is possible because of a dedicated network of volunteers committed to making culture an integral part of Saskatchewan community life, and vital funding from Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust for Sport, Culture and Recreation and Canadian Heritage. For more than 50 years Sask Lotteries has been the main fundraiser for more than 12,000 sport, culture and recreation groups in communities across the province. Since 1974, through an agreement with the Government of Saskatchewan, lottery sales in Saskatchewan have been used to provide more than \$1.4 billion to support athletes from the grassroots level to the international stage, connect youth to artistic experiences, help residents experience the beauty of the parks that cover the province and so much more.
